Annual Report of the Trustees for the year ended March 2008

The Breathing Life Trust is constituted by Trust Deed dated 13 December 2003 and is a registered charity (no.1102851). The charity was formed to aid relief of young persons suffering from respiratory illness or disease. To provide lung function equipment, to promote research and development of treatment and causes of respiratory diseases, the results of such research to be made public.

Membership of the Charity shall be open to individuals or body association interested in furthering the work of the charity. The Executive Committee shall consist of not less than 3 members and no more than 6 members in addition to the Chairman Treasurer and Secretary. All members of the Executive Committee shall retire from office together at the end of the Annual General Meeting next after the date on which they came into office, but they may be re-elected or re-appointed.

Donations towards the purchasing of equipment for the new centre have been received from several corporate and individual benefactors and we have been overwhelmed with wonderful letters of support and encouragement.

We do need donations to acquire the remaining pieces of equipment for the new centre and hope to achieve our fundraising target by the end of March 2009 so that all of the lung function equipment can be ordered in time for the opening of the centre in June 2009.

The Breathing Life Trust Accounts confirm in excess of £28,000 on deposit at various banks in the UK and Cyprus with total donations of monies and equipment now reaching £101,000 (including a donation of a polymerase chain reaction (PCR) from the Makarios 111 hospital Nicosia)

The Executive Committee actively review the major risk which the Charity faces on a regular basis and believe that maintaining reserves at the desired level combined with an Annual Review of the controls over the key financial systems will provide sufficient resources in the event of adverse conditions. The trustees have also examined other operational and business risks faced by the charity and confirm that they have established systems to mitigate risk

CHAIRMANS COMMENTS

PROGRESS SO FAR

Since 2004 the Breathing Life Trust has been raising awareness and campaigning for a dedicated state of the art children's lung centre, we are to name The Breathing Life Lung Centre for Children, which will serve the needs of children in Cyprus and the whole region, a 21st century state of the art respiratory facility of comparable standard to the world renowned Great Ormond Street Hospital in London, a facility that will save the lives of children with severe respiratory illness and give support to the many families who have to bear the pain of seeing their children suffering without hope.

It will be a much needed and utilised facility, as currently there is no medical centre of excellence for treating lung diseases on the island of Cyprus. In 2007 of the admissions of new born babies to the neonatal Intensive Care Unit at the Makarios 111 Hospital Nicosia, 55% related to severe respiratory difficulties and 28% of the admissions on the Paediatric Intensive Care Unit of the hospital were for severe lung diseases arising out of lung conditions.

The new centre will principally help newborn babies and young children by offering advanced diagnostic techniques in the treatment of life threatening respiratory illnesses and rare genetic defects of the respiratory system. It will also manage the treatment of thousands of children with severe respiratory illness and disease each year.

In June 2007 the precise needs and layout of the new centre were agreed. The Breathing Life Trust has now received approval from the Ministry of health of Cyprus to proceed with the project. It is our hope that the new centre will open in June 2009.
