Breathing Life Trust

Annual report of the Trustees for the year ended 31 March 2011.

The Breathing Life Trust is constituted by Trust Deed dated 13 December 2003 and is a registered charity (no.1102851). The charity was formed to aid relief of young persons suffering from respiratory illness or disease. To provide lung function equipment, to promote research and development of treatment and causes of respiratory diseases, the results of such research to be made public. Membership of the Charity shall be open to individuals or body association interested in furthering the work of the charity. The Executive Committee shall consist of not less than 3 members in addition to the Chairman Treasurer and Secretary. All members of the Executive Committee shall retire from office together at the end of the Annual General Meeting next after the date on which they came into office, but they may be re-elected or re-appointed.

Donations continued to be received from several corporate and individual benefactors and we have now received the target finances to acquire all the equipment for the new lung centre for children at the Makarios III Hoslital in Nicosia Cyprus. The new Centre opened on the 21st October 2009.

The Breathing Life Trust confirms the in excess of £1,826 on deposit at various banks in the UK and Cyprus with total donations of monies and equipment in excess of £200,000.

The Executive Committee actively reviews the major risks which the Charity faces on a regular basis and believes that maintaining reserves at the desired level combined with an Annual Review of the controls over the key financial systems will provide sufficient resources in the event of adverse conditions. The trustees have also examined other operational and business risks faced by the charity and confirm that they have established systems to mitigate risks.

Chairman's Comments Progress so far

This past year has been a year of consolidation. Our main focus has become the Art for Life Prize international art and poetry competition which is circulated among 6000 schools on Cyprus and Greece. It is hoped the Prize will become an annual event, as we believe it ultimately has tremendous potential to encourage children and young adults to actively engage with our charity's activities, as well as encouraging awareness for those in need of support. The Breathing Life Lung Centre which open in October 2009 has been a tremendous success, and is

gaining in importance.

We thank everyone for their continued support.
